Notice of Race

1. RULES

The regatta will be governed by the 'rules' as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing [RRS]. The regatta will be restricted to Category A advertising.

2. ELIGIBILITY

The Class Championship Regatta is open to all 2002-2003 members of the Lido 14 Class Association who meet the requirements of the Lido Class. Each registrant must timely present a duly completed registration, must pay the registration fee, and must receive an "O. K. to Race" by the Class Measurer and by the representative of the Class Championship Race Committee. The Bylaws at Article XVII paragraph 3 require that a competitor shall have actively and legally raced a Lido 14 for a minimum of at least 60 days prior to the commencement of the Regatta.

3. FLIGHT ASSIGNMENT (IF APPLICABLE)

Qualification Flights - For the scheduled three Qualifying Races, if over 25 boats register for the regatta, the Race Committee may, in its discretion, separate the Class into 4 flights (Blue, Green, Yellow and Red). Flight Assignments will be made by the Regatta Organizer after consultation with a committee of Fleet Captains selected by the Regatta Organizer. In this case Qualifying Race #1 will be Green competing with Yellow and Blue competing with Red; Race #2 will be Green competing with Red and Yellow competing with Blue; Race #3 will be Green competing with Blue and Red competing with Yellow.

Since it is essential to determine promptly the results of the Qualification Races to determine assignment to Gold and Silver Flights, and consistent with RRS 70.4(a), there will be no right of appeal from the decision of the protest committee concerning any race of the Qualification Series.

Championship Flights - For the Championship Races, the participants finishing in the top one-half of the Qualification Races, plus last year's Class Champion, will be assigned to the Gold Flight, with all others assigned to the Silver Flight. Provided, should it occur that there is a tie in points or an odd number of competitors which would affect Flight Assignment, any such affected competitor may elect to participate in the flight of his/her choice; this changes RRS A8.

4. SCHEDULE OF RACES

Sunday, August 10, 2003 - Regatta check-in will commence at 12:00 p. m. and conclude at 3:00 p.m.

Sunday, August 10, 2003 - The warning for the Practice Race will be given as soon as possible following the start of the second race of the Junior Class Championship, but no earlier than 1:30 p.m.

Monday August 11, 2003 - Regatta check-in for those who have not completed the registration process will be accepted from 8:30 a. m. and continue until 10:45 a. m.

Monday, August 11, 2003 - A Competitors' Meeting is scheduled for 11:00 a. m.; Qualifying Race(s) # 1 is scheduled for 12:30 p. m.; Qualifying Race(s) #2 and 3 are scheduled to follow Race(s) 1 and a short lunch break.

Tuesday, August 12, 2003 - The warning for the Gold Flight Championship Race #1 is scheduled for 1:00 p. m. The warning for the Silver Flight Championship Race #1 is scheduled to promptly follow the Gold Flight Championship Race #1. The warning for the Gold Flight Championship Race #2 will promptly follow the completion of the Silver Flight Championship Race #1 and a short lunch break.

Wednesday August 13, 2003 - The warning for the Gold Flight Championship Race #3 is scheduled for 1:00 p. m. The warning for The Silver Flight Championship Race # 3 will promptly follow the start of the Gold Flight Championship Race #3. The warning for the Gold Flight Championship Race #4 will promptly follow the completion of the Silver Flight Championship Race # 3 and a short lunch break.

Thursday, August 14, 2003 - The warning for the Gold Flight Championship Race #5 is scheduled for 1:00 p. m. The warning for The Silver Flight Championship Race #5 will promptly follow the start of the Gold Flight Championship Race # 5. The warning for the Gold Flight Championship Race # 6 will promptly follow the completion of the Silver Flight Championship Race #5 and a short lunch break.

5. BOAT LAUNCHING & STORAGE

MBYC has three dirt/sand launch ramps and two cranes for launching boats.
Dry storage and boat washing areas are also available.

6. MEASUREMENT

Limited boat and sail measurement will be available for those who have no Fleet Measurer available to them will be held on Saturday August 9, 2003 and on Sunday August 10, 2003 by appointment only. Appointments if needed should be arranged with the Chief Measurer, Eric Kownacki by email at eric@polarispool.com or by phone at 858-487-3782.

7. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Sailing Instructions will be available at check-in.

8. RACING AREA

The racing area will be in the Sail Bay part of Mission Bay.

9. COURSE

The courses will be windward-leeward, triangles, or tour-de-bay courses as selected by the Principal Race Officer from the then current MBYC course chart.

10. SCORING

For the Qualification Series, 3 races are scheduled. At least one race must be finished for each flight for completion of this series. For the Championship Series, 7 races are scheduled (including the carry over). Three races (including the carrying over) are required for the completion of that series.

Except as otherwise noted, the Low Point scoring system of Appendix A will apply.

For the Qualification Series, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores; this changes RRS A2.

For the Championship Series, when fewer than 7 races have been completed (including the score carryover from the Qualification Series) a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores; this changes RRS Appendix A2.

The standings e. g. 1, 2, 3 [not the points] from the Qualifications Series shall be counted as one of the races to be considered in the calculation of scores for the Championship Series. For the Silver Flight, the standings will be adjusted such that the best score for the boat assigned to the Silver Flight shall be awarded 1 point, etc. If an exclusion of a score is allowed as above provided, this Qualification Score Carryover will be considered as a race score subject to exclusion.

For the Championship Series, when fewer than six races plus the carry-over (i. e. seven scores) have been completed by the flights, no score shall be excluded. This changes RRS Appendix A2.

11. EQUIPMENT AND MEASUREMENT CHECKS

At check in, each registrant shall present to the Chief Measurer or his proxy and to the Representative of the Class Championship Regatta a duly completed measurement checklist utilizing the form included in the Registration Materials. The checklist shall certify that such boat has been duly measured, has a completed measurement certificate, and that each of the specific measurements items shown on the checklist form have been rechecked in anticipation of this Class Championship Regatta. The Checklist for each boat shall be signed by the participant's Fleet Measurer or his proxy, or failing that by the Class Measurer. When duly completed, and consistent with Article XVIII of the Class By-Laws, the Chief Measurer or his proxy and the representative of the Class Championship Race Committee will each endorse their "okay to race" on the Measurement Checklist.

12. AWARDS

Take home trophies will be awarded to the skipper and crew of the top ten finishing boats in the Gold Flight.

Take home trophies will be awarded to the skipper and crew of the top five finishing boats in the Silver Flight.

The W.D. Schock Trophy will be presented to the Class Champion

The Warren F. Pomeroy Memorial Trophy will be presented to the Winner of the 1st Gold Flight Race.

The President's Trophy will be presented to the Winner of the 2nd Gold Flight Race.

The Governing Board Trophy will be presented to the Winner of the 3rd Gold Flight Race.

The Longest Journey Trophy will be presented to the team that traveled the furthest.

The Fleet 2 Trophy will be present to the winner of the Silver fleet.

The First Lady Perpetual Trophy will be presented to the first woman skipper.

The Jim Tyler Trophy will be presented to the first family.

The Grand Master Trophy will be presented to the First skipper 50 years or older.

The Team Trophy will be presented to the team with the lowest team score.

Special awards will be given of all other competitors attending the trophy presentations.
