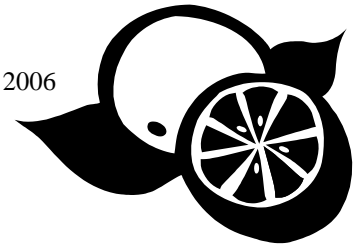




Notice of Race
2005/2006 Sunkist Series & CHOC Regatta

SUNKIST SERIES: Nov. 5-6, Dec. 3-4, 2005 & Jan. 7-8, Feb. 4-5, 2006
CHOC REGATTA: November 5th & 6th, 2005
Inside Classes on Saturday / Outside Classes on Sunday



(1) RULES

The regatta will be governed by the "Rules" as defined in the current Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS). The MIR Rule as stated in section 8 of the PHRF rulebook will not apply.

(2) ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 2.1 The regatta is open to all members of recognized US SAILING organizations.
- 2.2 Sunkist Inside/Outside: There will be no entry fee for Inside classes. There will be a \$20.00 entry fee for Outside Classes.
- 2.3 CHOC Inside/Outside: An entry fee of \$25.00 for Inside Classes (includes CHOC Burgee & T-shirt) & \$50 entry fee for Outside Classes (includes CHOC Burgee & two T-shirts). In addition, a suggested donation of \$25 Per Person to CHOC is requested (T-shirt Included).
- 2.4 Competitors must register at the BYC Race Office no later than 1000 hours before the first start on any race day. Only one entry is needed for the entire Sunkist Series.
- 2.5 Sailing Instructions and Course Charts will be available on or before November 4th, 2005.
- 2.6 **There will be a brief Skippers Meeting on the BYC Flag Deck at 1230hrs Nov 5th for Inside Classes and 1030hrs Nov. 6th for Outside Classes.**

(3) RACING AREA

- 3.1 Inside Classes: The Starting and Finishing area will be at the BYC Race Tower with courses inside Newport Harbor.
- 3.2 Outside Classes: The Starting area will be inside Newport Harbor, east of the Pavilion with courses racing outside or possibly inside for some or all of the classes. The Finishing Area will be off the BYC Race Tower.

(4) NUMBER OF RACES, COURSES, AND CLASSES

- 4.1 Inside Classes: There will be one race attempted each day for the Harbor 20's, and two races attempted each day for all other classes. The courses will be described in the Sailing Instructions. The Regatta is open to all Sabots, Harbor 20, Lido 14 A's & B's, Thistles, CFJ's, Lasers, T-12's, Balboa 13 and any other class under 20ft in length with five or more boats per start.
- 4.2 Outside Classes: The Regatta is open to PHRF, Etchells, Shields, Santana 20's, and any other class with five or more boats per start. One race will be attempted each day, and the course will be described in the Sailing Instructions.
- 4.3 The Order of Start for Inside Classes will be determined by the Race Committee and posted on BYC's Official Notice Board (ONB) no later than 1030hrs on Nov. 6th. PHRF Class Breaks and the Order of Starts for Outside Classes will be determined by the Race Committee and will be posted on BYC's (ONB) no later than 1030hrs on Nov. 7th.
- 4.4 The Race Committee has the right to cancel or combine any classes if there are fewer than five starters.
- 4.5 **The first warning signal will be at 1250 hrs each day.**

(5) ALTERNATIVE PENALTIES

One complete 360 turn, including one tack and one gybe, in the same direction will be used as an alternate penalty. This changes RRS 44.2

(6) SCORING

- 6.1 Inside Sunkist: The Low Point Scoring System (RRS Appendix A) shall apply for the series except as modified herein. Four races (4) are scheduled for the Harbor 20's eight races are scheduled for all other classes. Two races shall constitute a series. If there are less than four (4) completed races, no throw-outs will be provided. If there are four (4) to seven (7) completed races, one (1) throw-out will be provided. Two (2) throw-outs will be provided if eight (8) races are completed.
- 6.2 Outside Sunkist: The series will be scored as provided in Appendix A of the RRS using the Low Point System. Four (4) races are scheduled with one (1) race constituting a series. One (1) throw-out will be provided if all four races are completed.
- 6.3 CHOC: The Low point scoring system, Appendix A of the RRS will apply. No throw-outs will be provided.
- 6.4 Boats will only be scored for the regatta(s) they are entered in.

(7) PRIZES

- 7.1 Sunkist: The number of entries will determine the number of prizes in each class.
- 7.2 CHOC: Prizes will be awarded to the classes as described in the SI's. Special trophies will also be presented to the boat that generates the greatest dollar contribution to CHOC.
